Police apologise for city killings

THE POLICE have apologised to residents of Kalerwe for Tuesday's shooting, in which a school boy and a special Police constable (SPC) were killed by stray bullets during a botched security operation.

Police killings trigger city riot

Police commissioner for community affairs, Asan Kasingye, delivered the message on behalf of the Inspector General of Police, Maj. Gen. Kale Kayihura.

"I have come here to apologise because we lost two lives in the hands of errant Police officers," Kasingye said.

"We don't condone the act of taking peoples' lives in such an unlawful way. I promise that what took place should never happen again so that we have the public and the Police work together to prevent crime."

He handed over sh1m to each of the families of the victims as contribution towards the funeral expenses.

Addressing a press briefing earlier, Kampala Police Chief Edward Ochom said a female Police officer, who was in charge of the group of Probationer Police Constables at Kalerwe, had been arrested for neglect of duty.

"The constables had been placed under her supervision. She was supposed to have commanded them but she was not there, so we are holding her responsible," Ochom said at Kampala Central Police Station.

Corporal Eseri Madangu is being held together with five other policemen.

They were identified as Emmanuel Muduli, Ivan Mutamanya, Brain Balikuddembe, Yokana Muichi and Emmanuel Arinaitwe.

They will be charged with murder. The SPCs were trying to arrest a marijuana smoker when they came under attack, prompting them to open fire, killing 12-year-old Willy Byamukama by mistake.

The boy's death angered the residents and triggered off a riot, in which a Police patrol car was smashed and set ablaze.

The other victim was identified as Tom Ntanda, a policeman attached to Wandegeya Police Station.

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Two other suspects had been arrested in connection with torching the Police vehicle. The hunt for the third suspect is still on, the Police said.

On the involvement of the army in quelling the riot, Ochom said the Police had called for reinforcement from the Military Police.

Internal affairs state minister Matia Kasaija yesterday described the incident as unfortunate. A security operation like that did not necessitate the use of live ammunition, he said.

The opposition UPC condemned the killings and blamed it on lack of professionalism and inadequate training of SPCs.

“They use excessive force beyond what the law requires in arresting suspected criminals,” said UPC secretary general Peter Walubiri during the party’s weekly briefing.

“People have now begun looking at Police officers as enemies.”

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IT IS NOTHING OTHER THAN PURE TERROR.

Buganda is dealing with terrorists.

There have been over 20 fires which have destroyed property and lives in Ugandan schools since the year began. Radio Katwe would like to look into what is going on because we cannot believe that the only institutions in Uganda which are careless are schools.

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It is true that Ugandans rarely think twice about fires. In fact most of us go about our lives never caring so much about taking fire prevention measures. The capital city Kampala where the most precious things are has only the most rudimentary fire-brigade to speak of. So how come rampant fires have not been a way of life until just a few months ago?

The most suspicious cases are the schools of all places, that are bursting into flames almost every day. We have heard the Police talk of indisciplined children, carelessness and so on, but sincerely what has caused our children to become destructive all at once? Did children from Masaka to Moroto, Kasese to Tororo somehow organise and agree that 2008 is the year of burning things? For us we think that the national scale, timing and nature of these attacks leave no doubt that this a coordinated, targetted plan by a very powerful group that has a national reach.

New Vision on Monday wrote a good report on these fires and it said that they have been 25. On Monday two more fires in schools in Mukono and elsewhere brought the fires to 27.

The Overseer of the Intelligence agencies, General David Tinnyefuza, said that the fires are the work of a rebel group, the Allied Democratic Forces also known as the ADF.

According to one analyst who knows the method of Museveni and his NRA henchmen, as soon as Tinnyefuza blamed the over 25 school fires on the ADF, he gave the game away.

This analyst says that Museveni has always relied on campaigns of terror against the general population and the common man. After he orders his men to commit the atrocities, he blames them on the people whom he is fighting.

This is what Museveni did in the time of fighting Amin, in the Luwero Triangle and he had been doing it in northern Uganda since 1988, according to the insider.

Ugandans have been wondering about the fires. They are wondering how so many fires can break out at about the same time. They are also wondering why the fires should be affecting mainly schools, the most defenceless and vulnerable.

There were days in the past when Uganda did not have a vibrant private sector and that is when you could say schools would get burnt from negligence.

Today you see many schools which get a lot of school fees and the school officials make sure they care about things like fire extinguishers. People are asking why these fires should all be coming now.

The arson took a new twist on Sunday when the offices of the Red Pepper newspaper were attacked and also burnt. Red Pepper wrote after the fire that soldiers covered in hoods came to their office headquarters at Namanve and threw explosives into the compound. A generator costing over 100million shillings was destroyed.

Red Pepper is a paper which is believed to be close to the powers that be. So maybe Museveni decided that Red Pepper should also be burnt so that when he comes out and claims it is the work of ADF, Ugandans will believe it as Red Pepper is well connected to the government.

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The speculation is that to make the argument of ADF more convincing, attacks against other businesses like the New Vision which is a state paper could be staged.

Some sources who know Museveni's methods and timetable say that it is only a matter of time before the offices of the Daily Monitor also experience an incident (fire, attack etc) engineered by Museveni's agents and the ADF will take all the blame.

Another target could be Uganda House, the headquarters of the Uganda People's Congress party. Before the Budo fire in April, one afternoon Radio Katwe informers say the Minister of State for Security, Amama Mbabazi, drove to Uganda House.

It was a Saturday. Mbabazi came with his bodyguards. He got out of his car and looked up at Uganda House, he looked at the floors, at the restaurant, then he drove off. The visit was all rather strange. What was he inspecting? What did he want?

It will be no big surprise if Uganda House is on the list of prominent properties to be attacked in this campaign of terror.

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Arrest of kingdom ministers portends trouble for Mengo

I was shocked upon learning of the arrest of Buganda Information Minister Mr Peter Mayiga, Deputy Information Minister Mr Medard Lubega and chairperson of the kingdom's civic education committee Ms Betty Nambooze for inciting sectarianism.

The action of arresting the three Mengo notables reflected humiliation of the people they represent.

I am a listener to all of the accused's programmes on the kingdom's Central Broadcasting Service radio. While I sometimes find their language confrontational, their arrest will only inspire them to hero status and will only increase resentment to the NRM government.

Being the mouthpiece of the kingdom, whoever ordered their arrest should have respected their position in Ugandan society. The manner in which the youthful minister was arrested is a clue to what the police has already been accused of.

Why would an elite police force smash the window glass of a car whose occupant Nambooze cannot match the size of the smallest police constable? The image of the police force should be preserved.

Secondly, this should not have been done on the occasion of the Buganda Conference for it would loosely be interpreted that whoever arrested them was cowed by their achievement.

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The government should be made to know that the people of Buganda today are more united against any force that will seek to antagonise them.

Diplomacy would have been better than confrontation.

It was also conspicuous that Prof. Apolo Nsibambi, he of the Mawazo fame, did not attend the Buganda conference when colleagues Mazrui, Mamdani, Juuko and Sempebwa were indulging in intellectual discourse.

Why was Ms Ruth Nankabirwa and Speaker of Parliament Mr Edward Ssekandi the only notable people from the central government? Where was Prof. Makubuya? Was this scenario deliberate? Was it a reaction to Nsibambi's recent humiliation at the funeral service of the late Kiggundu? Is this how a government reacts to pressure from a non-armed force?

That said and done, closure of CBS radio could be next. But how will Baganda react? Are we not rapidly sliding back towards 1966? Time will tell.

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M7 might 'kill' Buganda, but it won't die - not yet

Two months ago, a phone discussion and email exchanges I had with the untiring Andrew Mwenda, chief of the newsmagazine The Independent, ended as an article in his magazine (and got the juices of the CID up, as they felt I had "insulted" the President with my choice of words).

In there, I argued that going on to 2011, Museveni had the option of courting anti-Buganda feeling in parts of the country, to find new sources of support for his president-for-life project. Anti-Buganda feelings, surprisingly, remained quite raw in several parts of the country, but Museveni's regime cleverly stoked them up, by appearing to give the region preferential treatment in his first few years in power.

Anyhow, quite a few people wrote in, puzzled at how exactly Museveni, who based his rebellion in Luweero, the heartland of Buganda, and whose electoral "victories" in the past were delivered by the massive support he enjoyed in the region, could ever end up in an Obote-type relationship with Buganda.

With the arrest of three Buganda kingdom officials on the weekend, and the expectation that more will be picked up in

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the days to come, there are now fewer puzzled people. All this is truly remarkable because one of the people arrested, lawyer Charles Peter Mayiga, was once considered “too soft” in negotiations with Museveni by hardliners in Mengo, and some of whom even labeled him a traitor.

So is it Museveni who changed, or the likes of Mayiga? The radicals in Buganda were always seen to be too crude, even “ungrateful”, in the demands they made upon Museveni for “federo” (a watered down form of federalism), the return of Buganda’s vast tracts of “crown” land, and what they saw as Kabaka’s diminished status.

The moderates were thought to be better positioned to negotiate concessions from Museveni, and they promised that a gradual approach would eventually deliver Buganda the goods. But Museveni granted them nothing. Even the little they had, he took away. In disarray, moderates like PM Prof. Apolo Nsibambi joined Museveni, and were consigned to a life in political limbo.

Others like Mayiga became louder in their complaints about the central government stabbing Buganda in the back, and outspoken critics in the media. How did we come to this? Since Uganda’s independence, and especially Idi Amin’s time, the north (especially Acholiland) and Buganda have occupied a complex space in Uganda’s politics. It’s Buganda’s that has changed the most.

Conventional wisdom and stereotype used to have it that Buganda was relatively economically more developed than the rest of the country, so its elite would be reluctant to be engaged in violent politics because they would lose too much property. Also, that because it was the most modern region, its leaders were “corrupted” and so given to cutting deals, they would do a deal with the devil.

After the disputed December 1980 election, all that was proven wrong and thrown in the rubbish bin. It became apparent that it was, in fact, easier to mobilise an armed rebellion in Buganda precisely because it was once very prosperous.

People who were once rich, feel the pain of dispossession and poverty more than those who were always wretched. Buganda also poses a challenge that other regions don’t. For all the claims that Ugandan politics is tribal, in several respects, Buganda doesn’t fit the bill. Some of Buganda’s grievances are legitimate broad issues in democracies that have moved beyond tribal politics.

Its land rights claim are much like what we see in parts of Asia and Latin America. In Europe, especially in the former Soviet bloc, we are seeing the same cultural arguments about their past kings as we hear about the role of Mutebi. And Buganda’s “federo” is more or less the same form of self-determinationist demands one hears from Scotland, Northern Italy, and the Basque regions in France and Spain.

To compound matters, Buganda is aware that it has things every president in Uganda wants - votes, and rich lands. In the 2006 elections, for example, one in every five voters in Uganda came from just four districts; Kampala, Wakiso, Masaka and Mukono. The votes in these four districts, all of them in Buganda, were much higher than all the votes from the northern region.

Because Buganda is, relatively “modern”, it has demands that cannot be resolved purely by whoever is in State House giving it “tribal” gifts. It requires the kind of reforms, and policy actions that the Museveni government is incapable of, and that others failed to muster in the past.

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Also, Buganda is the one part of the country that has nearly a whole two generations of exiles, as the trek begun in the mid-1960s after the ouster of Kabaka Freddie Mutesa.

The result is that the Buganda Diaspora is Uganda's largest and provides a back-up for the region outside the control of the Uganda government that only the broader north is beginning to establish.

For Museveni, this means you can arrest all the Mayigas but you cannot really break Buganda' political back.

Senior Presidential Advisor and intelligence coordinator, Gen. David Tinyefuza, has said the July 18 arrest of three Buganda officials is a good thing. Charles Peter Mayiga (Minister of Information), Medard Lubega (State for Information) and Betty Nambooze Bakireke (Civic Education Central Committee chairperson) face terrorism charges, sedition, promoting sectarianism and inciting violence.

"That is purely a Police matter and I am not a policeman," Gen. Tinyefuza said on phone this week when asked to comment on reports that he was behind the operation.

The General described as "fertile imagination" claims by some Buganda officials that the humiliating manner in which the ministers were arrested resembles tactics he usually employs. "They are crazy," he said.

Tinyefuza added that while the arrests were a Police matter, intelligence and armed forces usually complement one another.

But Tinyefuza also approved of the arrests, saying that he would not have minded doing it.

"I wouldn't mind doing it. Actually I would do it. It is a wonderful thing, very good and you can quote me," he said.

Asked why he was celebrating the arrest of Buganda ministers, Tinyefuza said he would substantiate that later.

Below, excerpts from the interview.

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## On mobilizing tenants

Reminded that during a recent tour of Kayunga he incited tenants (bibanja holders) against land owners, Tinyefuza said, "I said more than that.

I told them that if the law cannot protect them, they should protect themselves. You see peasants being thrown away. It is unacceptable. "I don't know why people treat tenants differently from the way they would treat shop-keepers. Chasing someone from kibanja is like chasing someone from his shop, then you go behind the counter and begin selling his merchandise. States don't run like that.

"The reason I get involved is because these are potential areas of conflict. As a person who heads security, we must act before these things spill over. We must make sure that these matters don't escalate into insecurity."

Does the law allow soldiers speaking out on such matters?

"The law doesn't allow any soldier to speak.

But other than being the coordinator of intelligence, I am a Senior Presidential Advisor on Security and I can speak in that capacity. Just like I can go to Parliament and speak as an army MP, an ordinary soldier cannot do that. I speak because for me I am assigned. Other soldiers have been appointed or seconded; for example former Chief of Staff Brig. Sam Nanyumba was in Rwanda as an ambassador and would address press conferences".

Arrest of Mengo ministers good?

"As long as they have a case and Police has evidence. If they were breaking the law, it is good they were arrested. We don't want anarchy. These are very weak states which we are trying to mould. You make a mistake and they go on fire. We don't want to slide back to the days of duka duka, it is very expensive, and you cannot believe it man".

Why move Mengo ministers to Ibanda, Kyenjojo?

"The question should be how they are treated. Are these places in Congo? Are they in Yugoslavia? This is not inter-territorial shifting. Are these places in Sudan? How does Police investigate? I would not accept a Ugandan being shifted out of our territory. A suspect can be shifted to any place in the country. This (Ibanda, Kyenjojo) is not Kinshasa! Is it not in Uganda? Complaints against shifting detainees to other places in the country makes the point, why Gandanise the arrest? For example, Maj. Gen. Jim Muhwezi was arrested (reminded that Jim has actually pointed to his ethnicity Abahororo).

That Bahororo thing is just stupid. Where does Mukula come from? I had problems the other day and I went to court; I didn't say I was a Muhima. Does Buganda have a Police? It must be the state. If a Munyoro minister commits a crime, we can't touch him, if a minister in the government of Rukidi Kabamba the king of Tooro commits a crime, we can't touch him, Tinyefuza is related to Prince Barigye ...

Then we better go back to the small states before the colonialists came and even build walls like those of the Chinese and then be happy. I find it a bit ... Besigye has been on charges of terrorism. You need to look at these young people may be they were getting excited".

Fate of Mengo ministers

"They are going to be charged in courts of law. They will be treated fairly. I don't think people should worry. The whole thing is satire. People like Lukwago who is an actor like Bakayimbira are taking advantage of the arrest to gain political

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capital. You know Baganda say amaziga gente lye sannyu lye mbwa. He (Lukwago) is really acting, sad story. They want to make political capital. They will be treated humanely”.

In an unprecedented move, Kabaka Ronald Muwenda Mutebi yesterday evening telephoned Betty Nambooze to wish her a quick recovery.

Nambooze, the chairperson of Buganda's Central Civic Education Committee, is admitted at Rubaga Hospital, suffering from trauma after having spent six torrid days in detention. She was arrested on July 18 together with Mengo ministers Charles Peter Mayiga and Medard Lubega. Nambooze and Lubega were last week charged with sedition, inciting violence and promoting sectarianism on radio while Mayiga was released on police bond without charge.
